To: Market Goat Exhibitors (meat does, meat wethers and dairy meat wether goats)

Dear Members, Parents and Advisors:

All Junior Fair market goats must be identified. This is a mandatory requirement for this project. An exhibitor will have 2 options to have your animals identified for the fair this year:

1. The identification clinic for market goat projects will be held at the Mercer County Fairgrounds on **Friday, April 24, 6:00-8:00 p.m. OR Saturday, April 25 from 9:00-10:30 am.** You do not need an appointment. **PLEASE NOTE DATE CHANGE – this is a change from the original date.**

OR

2. You may select to have, at your own expense, your veterinarian visits your farm and tag your animals. You must pick up tags and paperwork at the Extension Office, make an appointment with your vet, have animals tagged and paperwork completed and **return this paperwork to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 25.** Animals tagged on the farm will NOT be eligible for the rate of gain class. **Please note that April 25 is a firm deadline.** In fairness to all exhibitors involved, ownership dates must be the same for everyone. Having stated that, do not wait until the last minute to make an appointment with your veterinarian.

As an alternative for those families who do not wish to bring their animals to the fairgrounds, see list below for veterinarians who have been sent tagging information.

Tags can be picked up from the Extension Office. Office hours are Monday – Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. The office may be closed from 11:30-1:00, so if you plan to come at that time, please call ahead first.

Policies regarding Market Goats:

1. An individual may tag a maximum of five market goat animals (does or wethers). An exhibitor may show two of these five identified animals in the junior fair as their market goats.
2. Animals are to be owned by the exhibitor or the exhibitor’s family or farm business.
3. Families may share goats. A family means those junior fair eligible youth who are siblings, half-siblings or stepsiblings.
4. Family shared policies are as follows:
 - Each exhibitor must identify one animal as their project. This animal cannot be shared by anyone else.
 - Each exhibitor may identify a maximum of four additional animals as family shared animals.
 - The exhibitor of the family shared animal must be stated when the animal is weighed at the fair.

Scrapie Identification Exhibitor/Owner Statement

All animals must have a Scrapie tag in their ear prior to tagging. **Animals cannot be tagged for the fair without an existing Scrapie tag.** Scrapie tagging is the law. If you are purchasing a goat, **make certain that the goat (s) are Scrapie tagged from the breeder prior to you taking possession of the animal.**

The Exhibitor/Owner Statement document enclosed in your envelope is mandatory. This form must be completed thoroughly before an animal can be tagged or weighed in. The state vet may review these forms before and during the fair. Please make sure you have the all the information about the “Flock of Origin” before purchasing an animal. If you have purchased animals from multiple flocks, then please get another form from our website or the Extension Office before April 26.

All male goats are to be castrated prior to tagging. Animals are not to have horns. Exceptions to these requirements will not be granted.

Procedure for Retagging Market Goat that Lose their Ear Tag

It is the exhibitor’s responsibility to monitor their animal’s ear tags. If you determine that your market goat has lost its ear tag, call the Extension Office, (419) 586-2179, immediately and report it. In order to have your market goat retagged it must be approved by the adult Goat Superintendent. Monitor your market goat’s ear tags very closely and report any missing tags immediately!
