

2021 Non-Livestock Virtual Project Judging

The virtual project judging option is a way for members to earn a completion award and potential outstanding award without attending in-person judging. **All virtual submission must be made over email.**

The guidelines listed below are the *minimum requirement* to obtain a "completion" for 2021:

To submit your project for a completion evaluation:

- 1. Prepare your answers in a Word document or body of the email message. *Please do not share google docs with us.*
- 2. If you have more than one project you are submitting, please include only one project per email.

- 3. The subject line of the email should include the name of the member and project book title.
- 4. Send your email and/or Word document to the designated person for your project area.

To submit your project for an outstanding award:

Members who choose to share more information based on the questions on the chart above or use a different platform (i.e. PowerPoint, video, YouTube, etc), or add their own creativity will have an opportunity to earn an Outstanding Award. A simple way to take your project one step further is including photos with your submissions. These photos could show member completing activities, creating items, or anything else showing how the member learned throughout the project. Think about what you would have included in your portfolio or poster board.

Outstanding awards will be selected by the judge. Members who earn an outstanding award will be entered into a drawing for a gift card.

What happens next?

Once we receive your submission, the judge will evaluate the project based on a member's age and expect that answer's will reflect their grade level. Members will receive an email within 3 business days that their project submission was received and is correctly done for completion as well as feedback from the judge. Members will hear about outstanding awards at a later date.
