Due to our tax-exempt status through the university, Ohio 4-H Clubs and affiliates cannot fundraise via raffles, or other schemes in which dollars are given in direct exchange for changes or receiving anything of significant value in return. We can, however, when our association with those groups does not present conflict of interest in the philosophies of the university, Extension, or 4-H youth development.

Although your club can receive a donation made from a raffle, this becomes a gray area and can lead to the events being canceled. In these events, the members often become the “sale person” for these events and clubs cannot be apart of the fundraiser. An example of how this could work: A local organization is hosting a reverse raffle and donating back some proceeds to local charities. Your club among other community organizations was selected to receive money after the event. Your members can not be expected to sell tickets or work at the event to earn the money though.
