

Club History Scrapbook

Due September 1st

Purpose: The purpose of the Club History Scrapbook project is to encourage 4-H members assigned by their club to document their club activities and accomplishments throughout the year. The scorecard below is meant to just be a guide for minimal requirements. Members can add additional information as the club wishes.

Members should focus on the content in the scrapbook. The scorecard is reflective of this to encourage members to document their club's history in a fun, simple way.

Scrapbooks can be created in a binder, PowerPoint presentation or other electronic version, or any other creative method upon which the club decides. If you are creating a Promotional Scrapbook as well, you are welcome to create one scrapbook meeting both sets of requirements or two separate scrapbooks.

Cover Sheet inside the scrapbook (required):

- Club's name
- Name and Years of service of advisors
- Club Member's Names and years of membership
- A bio of your club - 50 words or less describing your club's uniqueness

Scoring and Awards: Below is the score card that will be used for the contest. Any clubs that reach at least 80 points will earn a \$20 cash award.

Document demonstrations completed at club meetings either in pictures or narratives	10 points	
Draws attention- clever design, theme and creativity	10 points	
Pleasing Appearance- neat & attractive presentation	10 Points	
Reflects your 4-H Club- scrapbook effectively portrays the club's experience and what makes your club special	10 Points
