

Dear Rabbit Exhibitors

We will have health check and tattooing in the rabbit barn on July 7 and 8 from 6pm to 9 pm.

For our skillathon this year I am sending you a sheet of questions that you will have to answer. Also you will need to pull page 5 and 19 from your breeding animal project record book and answer these 2 pages and bring these 3 sheets along to the health check and tattooing. You will also get a rabbit entry form to fill out and bring along that evening to. In your breeding animal project record book you will not have to do pages 7,13,14,15, and 17, and on page 11 the answer will be the rabbits that you are taking back home. In the market book you will not have to do page 10. Please fill out your books even though we will not be grading them.

The night of health check I will have a sheet for you with more info on for the shows and other things that you will need to know. I hope, maybe we can get together sometime during the week of July 20th and work on showmanship.

If you need any help, you need to call me. If anybody needs any rabbits yet you need to call. You will need your market rabbits by July 6, 2020. Dan Roebuck will have some but you will need to let him know. His phone number is 419-953-5858. Your breeding rabbits you should already have by June 1st 2020.
