

2020 Mercer County Livestock Skillathon

Each year, we require all livestock members to participate in pre-judging/skillathon for their livestock project(s). This gives them a chance to demonstrate what knowledge they have acquired through their 4-H/FFA livestock project. The pre-judging gives 4-H members their completion for the 4-H program year and is a prerequisite for livestock shows.



Due to restrictions in place with COVID-19, we will not be hosting an in-person pre-judging/skillathon this year. Members will be responsible for submitting their information that is outlined below for a private judging.

Members will not turn in their record book this year but will provide some information from their record book with their electronic submission. It is still best practice to complete your entire record book to ensure you have documentation of your animal project.

Members must complete an assignment listed below based on their 4-H age and specie. Show multiple species? You must complete an assignment for each specie, just as you would have completed multiple skillathons.

For example:

- If you are showing two market hogs, then you complete the assignment once
- If you are showing a beef steer and a market hog, then you complete the assignment twice
- If you are showing, a market lamb and a breeding lamb, then you complete it once

Members must complete this virtual judging to be eligible to show at the fair. Members can still earn outstanding ribbons for going the extra mile when completing their submission. Members will who earn outstanding awards will be placed in a drawing for gift cards. The gift cards will replace the herdsman award for 2020.

How to submit your completed work:

Members will email their completed assignment to Beth Guggenbiller (Guggenbiller.23@osu.edu). **In the title of the email, please include your name and specie. This information must be submitted by July 10.**

All Junior Fair livestock exhibitors (with the exception of Rabbit, Poultry and Dog members) will complete their Fair Entry submission by July 10. Fair Entry is the platform we use to know what animals you are bringing to the fair. See additional attachment for directions.

Age Brackets:

Junior: 8 to 12 years of age as of January 1

Intermediate: 13 to 14 years as of January 1

Senior: 15 to 18 years as of January 1
